Manitoba Justice Security Training Programme

Wednesday, November 30th, saw the graduation of the first class of Commissionaires trained using the Manitoba Justice Security Training Programme. This training course is the new, “made in Manitoba” requirement for all Private Security Guards in the Province effective 1 April 2006. The training was validated by having all the candidates write the regular CGSB exam in addition to the Manitoba Justice exam. Everyone was successful.

Other Security Guard companies are running pilot courses with varying results. Our training team of Bob Shawcross and Len Baspaly provided an outstanding course with the results to prove. Effective April 2006, all Commissionaires will require to be licensed to work in the province, prior to this time the Corps has been exempt from the licensing requirement.

Those Commissionaires who have completed the Commissionaire Qualifying Course in accordance with the CGSB Standard will not have to take any further qualification training.

Another training course is scheduled to commence Monday, 5 December 2005, as well as January 10th, 2006. We need the people as we have the business.
