What do you get paid?

In the Fiscal Year 2005/2006 the average paid wage per Regular hour worked was \$10.57, during this FY that rate is \$10.89. Well who are these lucky Commissionaires who are getting that much and how do I get transferred to that site?

The operative phrase here is “**average paid wage per Regular hour worked**” and this does not equate to your regular paid rate.

Take the case of Commissionaire Bloggins who earns a Basic Pay Level of \$9.30 per hour. He works Monday to Friday, 0800 – 1600, or 2080 Hours per year. He worked 6 Statutory Holidays at double time and a half (\$23.25) and he also had two Stat Holidays which he did not work but was paid for anyway. His mother-in-law passed away and he was granted three days bereavement leave and he took two weeks vacation.

Commissionaire Bloggins actually worked 1824 Regular Hours for which he was paid \$16,963.20 plus \$1116.00 Stat Holiday pay, plus \$148.80 Stat Holiday paid but Not Worked plus Bereavement Leave \$223.20 and \$792.12 for Vacation Pay. The Total was \$19,403.52 or an average of \$10.64 per Regular Hour Worked.

Jury Summons

Any Commissionaire who is in receipt of a Jury Summons is required to call the Jury Coordinator Winnipeg Courts at 945-5740 within 7 days of receipt of the summons to confirm your attendance or your intention and reason for requesting an exemption. If your intend is to ask for an exemption contact the Division Office immediately to ensure the proper paper work is raised. Note: The call to the Jury Coordinator **does not** get you exempt, it merely informs them of your intent.
