### **Security Guard Licensing Procedure**

Effective the 8<sup>th</sup> of January the Legislature proclaimed new rules for security guard licensing. Chief amongst the changes was that the Commissionaires would no longer be exempt from the requirement to be licensed. In February, Cmre Mike Forrest was brought into the Division Office to set in place a plan to get all Commissionaires who require licensing, an easy method to achieve the goal.

The Licensing process has three main parts. Each part is accompanied by forms to fill out(ugh!!), however, Mike has filled out 90% of these on your behalf using information that we retain on file. Each section still requires some input on your part.

### **Part 1 – Criminal Record Check**

All applicants must have Police Background Check that is less than 6 months old. This can be done by the Division Office. We will require two pieces of identification, at least one of which will have your photograph. A Manitoba Medical card is not acceptable. These should be photocopied on the same page if possible, and the originals must be available for review. If you have had a name change, such as in marriage, the legal document must be provided, eg Marriage License.

### **Part 2 – Child Abuse Registry Check**

The CAB check requires the same identification as the CPIC. This will be submitted on your behalf, however, the results will be mailed to you. When you receive the results, we will require a copy to submit to the Provincial Registrar.

### **Part 3 – The Application**

The majority of the application has been completed, and, as with the other parts there will be a requirement for signatures and attestations that you have completed the prerequisite training.

The intent is to commence the process on a site by site basis. The supervisor will be contacted and arrangements will be made to visit you at your workplace so as to minimize any disruptions. Commissionaires on the Spares Board will make arrangements with Cmre Forrest

at 942-5993 Ext 220 to make arrangements for the completion of the documentation.
